Description of Votes
1. Minnesota Constitutional Marriage Amendment – Place a state constitutional marriage amendment, defining marriage as the union of one man and one woman, on the 2012 ballot for Minnesota voters to vote on. It passed 38 to 27. SJ 1978, 5/2/11. MFC supported this bill.
2. Prohibit Abortions after 20 Weeks – Prohibit abortions after 20 weeks, except when mother's life is at risk or serious risk of permanent bodily impairment, which is one the unborn child can begin feeling pain. The bill passed 42 to 24. SJ 2062, 5/16/11. MFC supported this bill.
3. Stop Taxpayer Funding of Abortion – Stop taxpayer funding of abortion in state-sponsored health programs. The bill passed 40 to 26. SJ 2958, 5/20/11. MFC supported this bill.
4. Allow Taxpayer Funding of Human Cloning – Effort to drop prohibition on the use of taxpayer funds for human cloning. The amendment was defeated 25 to 39. SJ 1113, 3/30/11. MFC opposed this amendment.
5. Promotion of Homosexuality in Schools – Inclusion of homosexuality, bisexuality, cross dressing, and transvestitism as groups receiving special recognition under state's anti-bullying law. The amendment was defeated 28 to 35. SF 1141, 3/31/11. MFC opposed this amendment.
6. Raise Income Taxes – Raise income taxes and establish a new income tax rate for Minnesota taxpayers. The amendment was defeated 28 to 38. SJ 1129, 3/31/11. MFC opposed this amendment.
7. Expansion of State Regulation of Preschool Programs – Effort to expand state regulation and control of private day care and childcare and other early childhood programs. The amendment was defeated 28 to 36. SJ 1136, 3/31/11. MFC opposed this amendment.
